How to Paint Your Motorcycle at Home - DVD By Spritz by Fritz; www.spritzbyfritz.com; \$25

This two disk set is the best custom painting video I have ever seen. Fritz Schenck is an exceptionally talented



custom painter, having painted show winning cars and motorcycles for many years. He painted many of Indian Larry's best-known motorcycles as well as his own custom creations featured in Ol' Skool Rodz and Car Kulture DeLuxe. And he works out of a two-car garage like most of you.

In his video, Fritz explains everything, not only how to do it, but why to do it, and how it

works: mixing the paint, mixing filler, when to sandblast and when not to, preparing the surface, what to avoid, how to do things on the cheap and still get great results, laying down designs, sanding... everything. And he does it in a way that you can understand. The DVD set contains almost 3½ hours of instruction and every minute of it is worthwhile. Though the procedures are done start to finish on motorcycle parts, they work equally as well on cars. This is a must have set.

Vintage Torque 5 - DVD By John Wells; www.vintagetorque.com; §33

The next best thing to being there. That's the way to de-



scribe the Vintage Torque series, including #5. It's a two disk set and includes the same kinds of events we cover in Ol' Shool Rodz; in other words, your favorites (and ours): West Coast Kustoms Santa Maria, Dave Mann Chopper Fest, Mooneyes Xmas Party, Detroit Autorama, Jalopy Showdown, Lonestar Roundup, plus the art of Doug Horne, Suedes Car Club, and much more.


And his bibliography is a bargain besides.
